What You Will Do?

This individual will work in Fishers and Anderson locations.

The Physician Assistant or Nurse Practitioner will practice medicine with the supervision of a licensed doctor of medicine. Individuals in this role exercise autonomy in medical decision making and provide a broad range of diagnostic and therapeutic services. The clinical role of this position includes primary and specialty care in medical practice settings.

- Provide a broad range of diagnostic and therapeutic services under the supervision of physician, including but not limited to diagnosing and treating illnesses, giving medical advice, counseling patients, performing physical examinations, and treating minor injuries related to back or spine pain.
- Obtains complete medical history and physical data on patients; performs complete physical exams; interprets and integrates data to determine appropriate diagnosis and treatment plan.
- Collaborates with physicians in managing acute and long-term medical needs of patients.
- Orders appropriate laboratory and diagnostic procedures; administers medications and injections according to standard treatment plan and/or physician direction.
- Instructs and educates patient and family regarding medications and treatment instructions.
- Maintains and reviews patients' records, charts, and other pertinent information accurately and efficiently.
- Maintain an orderly and efficient flow of patients while obtaining patient vitals, collecting specimens as needed, obtaining/updating medical history information, ordering laboratory tests and/or x-rays.

What You Will Need:

Qualifications and Education Requirements

Graduation from an academic program accredited by the Commission on Accreditation of Allied Health Education Programs or an Accredited School of Nursing and successful completion of an approved Nurse Practitioner program. One to two years professional experience as a Physician's Assistant or Nurse Practitioner preferred. Experience in orthopedics and/or spine preferred, but not required.

Certification/License Requirements

Certification through examination by the National Commission on Certification of Physician Assistants (NCCPA) and licensed by the Indiana Professional Licensing Agency or ANA Certification and State Registered Nurse license required.
